








2022 MIDTERMS GUBERNATORIAL RACES




WHO WE ARE AS LATINOS

- 2020 census pointed out a drastic national spike, Latinos make up more than half of U.S. population's growth.
- Latinos casted 16.6 million votes in 2020, an increase of 30.9% over the 2016 presidential election. By comparison, turnout was 15.9% greater among voters of all races.
- 800,000 Latino citizens turn 18 every year, there could be more than 3 million new registered voters in four years
- Latinos play a key role in economic growth as their buying power is more than \$1.7 trillion


WHO WE ARE AS LATINOS

Note: Hispanics of any race. Black, Asian, and white are non-Hispanic, single race.



- 29.8 for Latinos or Hispanics


The Hispanic population has quadrupled in the past four decades.



WHATARE WE CALLED?

- Latino: refers to people who are from or descended from people from Latin America
- Hispanic: refers to people who speak Spanish or are descended from Spanish-speaking populations
- Latinx: refers to Latino but uses a gender-neutral (-x) suffix
- Chicano: refers to people of Mexican descent born in the United States
- Tejano: A Mexican American inhabitant of southern Texas.
